Stand & Be Recognized

Veterans please think of the 2012 reunion as the ticker tape parade you have earned but never received. You never ask for recognition, as a group or as individuals, but it is time for those of you who are able to attend this event to allow the public to acknowledge the achievements the 506th Fighter Group made during World War II. Recognition, while the central theme of this event, will come in an assortment of ways.

By now, you probably know that a P-51 has been painted as one of the 457th mustangs. *Kwitcherbitchin* is scheduled to be unveiled at this event. That introduction will be documented in an article in the aviation magazine, *Warbirds International*. The article about the plane will include information about the original plane's serving on Iwo Jima as well as lead-ins to the 506th being recognized by the magazine. Come and make sure the story is told correctly.

During the activities at the airport, there will be time set aside to sell the 506th book. That will include the veterans' being asked for autographs. While it might be embarrassing for some of you to sign the book, remember you are doing so, in part, for those who did not return form war or for those who are no longer around to attend the reunions.

Another event will be a "mission briefing". There will be a large contingent of young folks who are there to reenact the war days. On Saturday and Sunday, they will be reliving the briefing held before your June 1st mission. They want the 506th veterans there to insure the accuracy of the briefing.

An activity that may be of more interest to the families than to the veterans is the opportunity to purchase a ride in a warbird. At the event web site you can reserve a flight on a B-25 or on one of the 2 flying B-24s that remain from the 18,000 America produced. Or better, the only flying B-29 will be there offering rides for sale. For those who were unable to attend the 2011 reunion and want to fly a trainer, rides will be available in a PT-19 and a Stearman, plus the AT-6 Texan. And last, but not least, how about buying a ride in a P-51! While rides will be available all weekend, the best time will be on Friday. You should make a reservation, via the web site, for this opportunity to in fly a historic airplane.

Besides the activities at the airport, we will still have plenty of time together at the hotel to allow our veterans to retell the stories they told last year to another veteran, whose age has shortened his memory to a point he no longer recalls the story told last year, but enjoys hearing the yarn anew as if it were all true.

The key to this weekend will be participation by the veterans. This is the maximum effort reunion. Do all you can to attend. Bring your oxygen bottle, drive your wheel chair, grab your walking stick, but get there. And bring your family so they can better understand those days long gone. And families, if your veteran is no longer with us or is unable to attend, please come in his place. They need you to be here as their representatives. Please join us for the World War II weekend in Pennsylvania.

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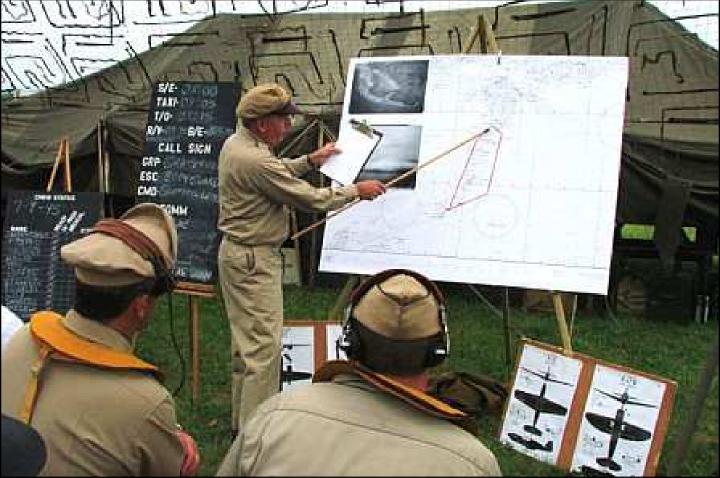
